### Station 1: Bill of Rights and Beyond

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### Station 2: Bill of Rights and Beyond

1. Each square of the Bill of Rights and Beyond represents an amendment, or addition, to the Constitution. Name one or two amendments you have never heard of before today.

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2. Explain what you think an Amendment you identified means in your own words.

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### Station 3: Bill of Rights and Beyond

1. Some amendments protect multiple rights. Choose one amendment of this kind to investigate and explain how the rights are connected.

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2. There are some amendments in the beyond section, 11-26, written in black. This represents that they are not considered amendments that extend citizens' rights. How can these amendments written in black be described?
